

## **Conflict Minerals Policy Statement**

American Axle & Manufacturing Holdings, Inc. (AAM) is committed to responsible sourcing, especially as it pertains to conflict minerals and compliance with Section 1502 of the U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act<sup>1</sup> (Dodd-Frank Act) and the Regulation (EU) 2017/821 of the European Parliament<sup>2</sup>. Furthermore, AAM supports the goal of ending violence and human rights violations globally, including the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and Covered Countries, and all conflict-affected and high-risk areas (CAHRAs).

AAM is a global Tier-1 supplier to the automotive industry with an international value chain. AAM manufactures driveline and metal formed products, among other, related items. As such, AAM has implemented a compliance and responsible minerals sourcing program designed in conformance with the internationally recognized OECD Due Diligence Guidance<sup>3</sup>.

On an annual basis, this program includes, but is not limited to:

- supplier engagement and education
- supply chain risk identification, assessment, mitigation, and remediation
- conducting a reasonable country of origin inquiry (RCOI)
- annual reporting, free and available to the public

AAM's responsible sourcing commitment is also manifested through its membership in industry, and cross-industry groups, such as the <u>Automotive Industry Action</u> <u>Group</u> (AIAG) and the <u>Responsible Minerals Initiative</u> (RMI).
